

INTRODUCTION

- Practice groups are key to the future of Eurojuris International, enabling lawyers to work and network together for the benefit of their clients.
- The groups will be a resource within Eurojuris International, where members will be available to advise other lawyers when needed in the promotion of their business.
- The practice groups will be made up of lawyers, specialists who will meet regularly through seminars, meetings and training events, relating to their area of practice.

For the time being, Eurojuris International recognises the following groups of lawyers/law firms:

- Ibero Francophone
- Specialist groups

These will now be known as Practice Groups.

DEFINITIONS

To become a member of a practice group a Lawyer/Law firm in the case of International Business Group must meet one of the following qualifying conditions:

For the Specialist Group :

1. Self declaration that the Lawyer is occupied with such specialist work for at least one third of his/her working time, and confirmed by an independent Lawyer, practising elsewhere.
2. The Lawyer holds/has held during the past 3 years a University position and/or membership of any other relevant legal institution relating to such legal specialisation or has published a relevant book or is a regular contributor to a recognised legal publication, in such specialisation.
3. Is recommended by the Chairperson of the practice group and/or the specialist group of his/her National association.
4. To ensure a positive and fruitful collaboration, a PG is to count at least 5 registered and paying members. If not, the PG will be removed from the website but still have the possibility to meet during congresses and PG days. Please also note that no meeting room will be foreseen for groups that count less than 5 participants.

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GENERAL AND COMMON OBLIGATIONS

- Each practice group will appoint a chairperson, who will organise a working committee.
